Nina worked as church secretary for awhile and then as bookkeeper for Jack's construction business. She enjoyed traveling and a trip to Jamaica was one of her favorite memories. In retirement Nina learned from her daughter Karen a love for gardening. She enjoyed seeing the beauty of her flower gardens and working in them as she was able. In 2011 Nina moved next door to Karen and her husband, Dave. She enjoyed visits with them yet her biggest joys were visits from their dog, Barkley. She would rush to get some treats to throw for Barkley to catch. She would tell him to "go long" and clap for 15 minutes each time he was successful at catching the treat before it fell to the ground. He would often settle into her lap and she would rock him. They were definitely big pals.

In August of 2020 Nina moved to Midland Texas to be near her younger

daughter, Linda. They lived 5 minutes apart which allowed them lots of time to visit. Their favorite pastime was playing Scrabble on the Xbox. Since neither of them were avid Scrabble players they enjoyed playing as a team against the computer. Nina got a big kick when they beat the computer and across the screen were big letters saying "YOU WON!" Linda would do a victory dance and they celebrated their win together. Another tradition they established were routine visits to the drive through line for smoothies on the way home from various appointments.

Nina left this earth on May 26, 2021 and is now resting in the presence of her Savior, Jesus Christ.
