Robbie Lynn Evans Maass, age 63, of Odessa, TX, met Jesus face to face on Monday, December 22, 2025 after extended battles with multiple illnesses.

Robbie was born on March 4, 1962 to Charles and Rita Evans in Odessa, TX. She graduated from Permian High School in 1980 and worked as a paraprofessional with Ector County Independent School District for many years.

Robbie grew up with two siblings and was the baby of the family by all accounts. She loved to pester them and squabbles were had, but she admired her sister and brother and loved spending time with them. Robbie and Tammy turned into the best of friends in her later years and they shared a beautiful bond. As a baby sister, Robbie became an aunt at a young age and cherished her nieces and nephews. She was a fun aunt who loved to play, let you stay up late, eat too much candy and soda, but she also kept your secrets and gave great advice.

Robbie met the love of her life, Wayne Maass, at the Stardust in early 1982 where they danced the night away. They quickly grew to love each other and

were married on November 2, 1982. Robbie followed Wayne to Oceanside, California where she supported his service in the Marines. They returned to Odessa in 1986 and welcomed two children, Lyndsey and David, over the next several years.

Robbie made her career as a paraprofessional in elementary education, elementary PE, and later as a school secretary. She loved her students with her whole heart and poured into them every day. She was the first to celebrate their accomplishments and she beamed with pride when she spoke about them.

Robbie enjoyed traveling, especially to the mountains of Colorado, reading, music, movies, watching sports, and home improvement and cooking shows, but her family was her entire world. She loved family outings, game nights, and watching Dave play baseball. She was a fun Mimi and loved trips to the park, singing silly songs, sidewalk chalk, and blowing bubbles. Robbie was loyal, a patriot, and had strong values she lived by and passed on. Robbie poured her heart into everything she committed to and had a genuine love for people. She had a wonderful sense of humor and her laughter was contagious. Robbie gave the best hugs and shoulder rubs, and strove to make people feel welcomed and loved. Robbie exemplified kindness.

Robbie's first love was her Savior, Jesus Christ. She was a devoted follower and a prayer warrior. Robbie and Wayne taught 5th grade Sunday School at Sherwood Baptist Church for many years, and when Wayne surrendered to ministry she welcomed her role as a pastor's wife and was active in women's ministry. Robbie loved to intercede for people, worship, and read her Bible. She was an excellent counselor during times of difficulty, and as her illnesses

progressed, she could not wait to go to her home in Heaven and meet her Lord.

Robbie is preceded in death by her parents, in laws, and son in law, Bryant. Her memory will be kept alive by her husband Wayne, of Odessa, children, Lyndsey and Roy of Waco, David and Shelbe of Odessa, and grandchildren, Morgan and James of Waco, and Chloe of Odessa. She will be dearly missed by her sister and brother in law, Tammy and Terry Crouch of Odessa, and brother and sister in law, Kelly and Beverly Evans of Odessa. She also leaves behind numerous nieces, nephews, aunts, uncles, cousins, and friends.

A celebration of Robbie's life and legacy will be held Saturday, December 27th at Stonegate Odessa Church, 4240 Preston Smith Road, at 1 pm with pastor Wayne Maass officiating.

The strong willed boy that grew into the man he is today. She was so proud. Then being Meme. Her grands. "Morgy" and James. Morgan's love for school and James' love for dinosaurs. Then Chloe. She adored them all with all of her hearts.

My thoughts and prayers are with the entire Maass and Evans family's. Robbie is with her first love now. Jesus. She is no longer struggling with anything.
